Consider the following points when you plan your composition:

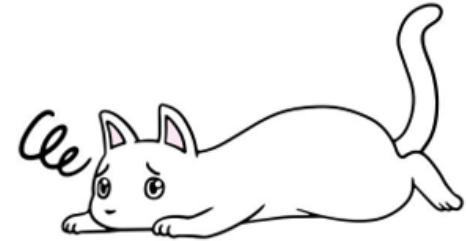
- Where was the vet clinic?

"Oh no! It's my turn again!" Simon cried as he checked the duty roster which his parents had drawn up for the family. "I have a lot of homework to do today!"

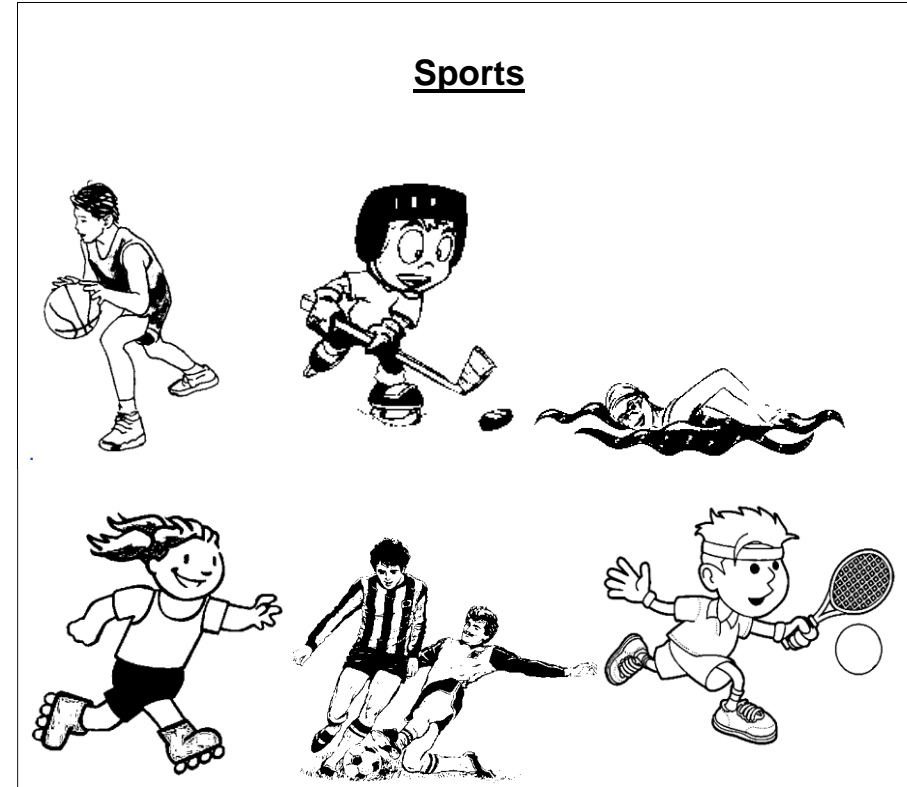

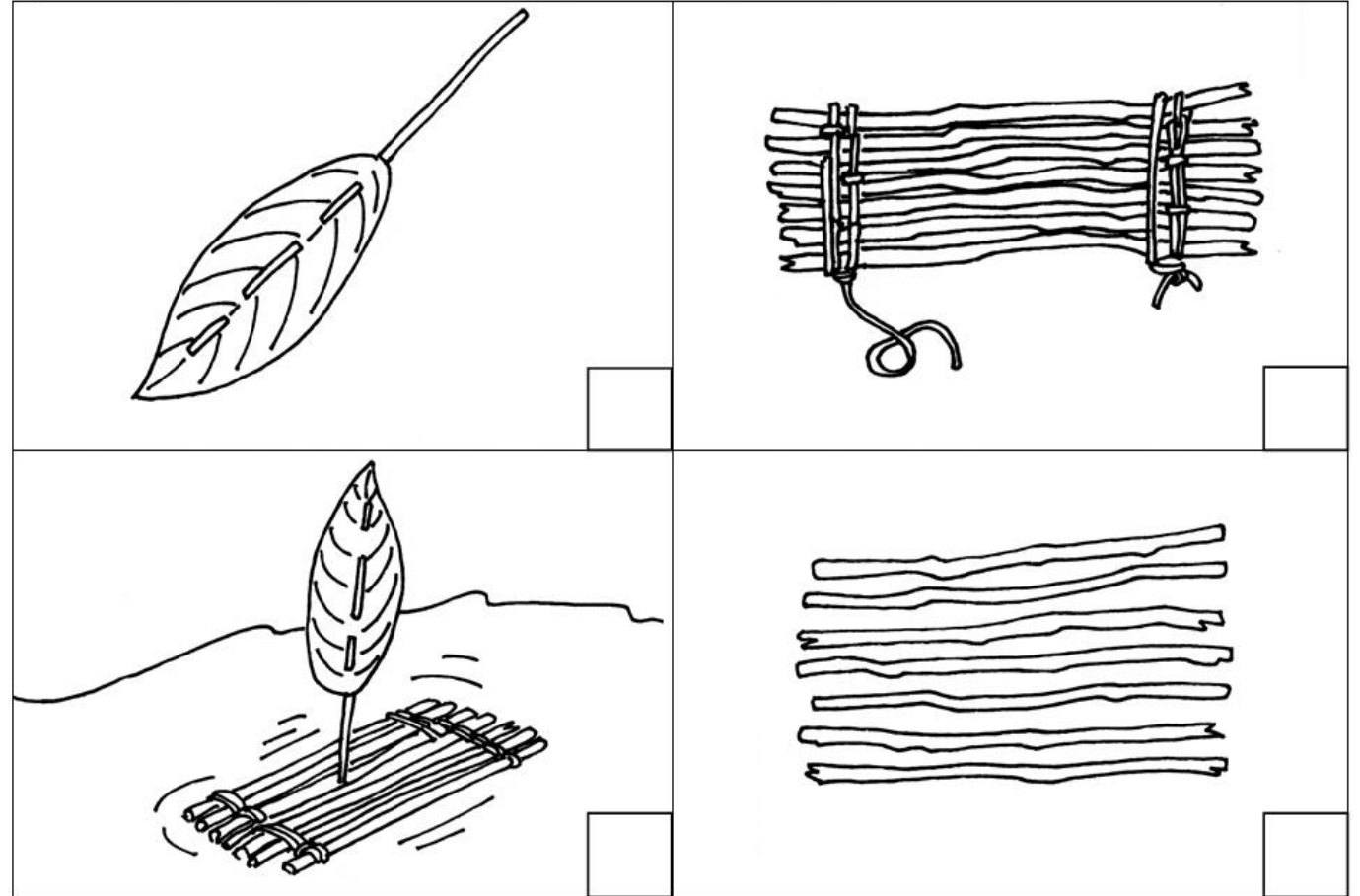

# Comprehension Cloze (sample)
