<p><i>"I can see you worked so hard on this."</i></p> <p>Say this because it helps your children understand you value their effort.</p>	<p><i>"You are so smart."</i></p> <p>Do not say this because it makes them think of intelligence as a fixed quality.</p>
<p><i>"It seems like it's time to try a new strategy."</i></p> <p>Say this because it lets your children know that they control outcomes by making choices.</p>	<p><i>"It's okay. Maybe you're just not cut out for this."</i></p> <p>Do not say this because it makes your children think they don't have the capacity to improve.</p>
<p><i>"I like watching you do that."</i></p> <p>Say this because it conveys a message of approval of an activity they enjoy doing, regardless of outcome.</p>	<p><i>"You're a natural at that!"</i></p> <p>Do not say this because the next time your children fail or make mistake, they might think they do not have the talent after all.</p>
