Affirming effort also helps your child develop resilience by teaching them to see challenges as opportunities for growth rather than as obstacles. Together, we can create an environment where every child feels empowered to reach their full potential, both inside and outside the classroom.

Say This	Not That
"I can see you worked so hard on this."	"You are so smart."
Say this because it helps your children understand you value their effort.	Do not say this because it makes them think of intelligence as a fixed quality.
"It seems like it's time to try a new strategy."	"It's okay. Maybe you're just not cut out for this."
Say this because it lets your children know that they control outcomes by making choices.	Do not say this because it makes your children think they don't have the capacity to improve.
"I like watching you do that."	"You're a natural at that!"
Say this because it conveys a message of approval of an activity they enjoy doing, regardless of outcome.	Do not say this because the next time your children fail or make mistake, they might think they do not have the talent after all.
