Dear Parents/Guardians,

Primary 2 Term 2 Level Matters

We have now come to the second term of the year. Here is an update on the activities planned for this term.

Programme for Active Learning (PAL)

Last term, Primary 2 students participated in the Performing Arts – Visual Arts module. In Term 2, they will embark on the Performing Arts – Dance module, which integrates Character and Citizenship Education (CCE), including National Education (NE) and the five Social and Emotional (SE) competencies: self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship management, and responsible decision-making. Our school's RICE values will also feature strongly. This holistic approach fosters the cohesive development of students' values, character, social-emotional well-being, and citizenship dispositions, contributing to positive life outcomes.

Physical Education, Art, and Music (PAM)

With regard to Physical Education, some of the Primary 2 classes have started their Gymnastics module in Term 1 and will continue to do so in Term 2. The rest of the Primary 2 classes will start their module in Term 2. In Games and Sports, they will continue to develop their throwing and catching skills through series of activities and games. Students will also have Dance lessons and Outdoor Education where they will learn basic orienteering skills and different weather conditions.

In our Primary 2 art curriculum, students embark on an exciting exploration of the natural world through the theme "*The View from My Window*." Inspired by Vincent van Gogh's iconic *Starry Night*, they experiment with lines, colours, and rhythm to create their own unique interpretations. Using mediums such as oil pastels and wax resist, they bring their visions to life while learning essential techniques in landscape composition.

For Music, students will continue their musical journey by exploring rhythm, tempo, and creative expression. They will learn to create and perform different rhythms using non-pitched percussion instruments. Through engaging musicking activities, they will listen to various songs to recognise and identify tempo – the speed of music. Additionally, students will have the opportunity to express their creativity by exploring, creating and performing soundscapes based on a given stimulus.

HI-LITE Programme: Baking Workshop

The students will be going for a baking workshop. More details will be communicated by their form teachers through Parents Gateway closer to the date.

Parent Child Teacher Conference (PCTC)

The PCTC will be held on 29 and 30 May 2025 (Thursday and Friday). More information will be provided closer to the date.

English Games Week is coming back soon! Students can look forward to a week of engaging games and activities in Term 3 Week 1 (30 June – 4 July 2025). These activities may be carried out during English lessons or recess. This initiative seeks to increase our students' interest and passion in English Language and to promote a reading culture. To launch the English Games Week, we will have Book Day on 30 June 2025 whereby Primary 1 and Primary 2 students are strongly encouraged to dress up as their favourite character from a story they have read. There will be fun activities and special programmes for our students to showcase their talents and skills in English Language. More details will be provided nearer the date.
