





- > Red patches to indicate school zone.
- ➤ School zone signage with 40kmph speed limit.
- ➤ Road markings to alert motorists of humps along Holland Grove Road.
- ➤ Hump & SLOW signages.
- Signalized pedestrian crossing along Holland Grove Road.
- ➤ Zebra crossing along Mount Sinai Road with signages to alert students to look out for traffic as part of "safe route to school" initiative.

How Can You Help?

To prevent traffic congestion and crowding outside the school gates along Holland Grove Road and Mount Sinai Road, we would encourage you to arrive only when the school gates open.

Parents who arrive before the school gates open have the following options (Stated below) instead of waiting /parking along Holland Grove Road:

- 1) Stretches in Mount Sinai Estate where there are no restriction lines. Parent can wish to park/wait at this stretches for a short while and move off once the school gates open.
- 2) HDB carpark at Ghim Moh Road

For the safety of the members of public, we would like to urge all drivers to exercise care and consideration by not parking at these critical areas:

- 3 metres within a fire-hydrant
- 6 metres within a junction
- Single white zig-zag line (zebra-controlled zone)
- On grass verge and footway &
- At entrances or exits of any other premises

Zebra Controlled Area

No stopping at all times on the road

Any vehicles stopping at location (other than waiting for traffic light to turn green or being block by another car or giving way to pedestrians) to issue NOPO

Unbroken Single Yellow Line

Vehicles are not allowed to park from 7.00 AM to 7.00 PM

Vehicles can be parked from 7.00 PM to 7.00 AM on weekdays and Saturdays; and whole day on public holidays and Sundays

Immediate loading/unloading permitted at all times









Parking within 6m of Junction





No parking or waiting at all time

No parking at all times within 6 metres of an intersection or junction of any road or street









Reminder

The Road Traffic Act prohibits parking on public roads marked with infringement lines, such as double-yellow or single continuous white lines, at any time and at critical areas as describe in the above slides. It is the responsibility of all motorists to comply with these rules.

Any vehicles parked on such roads can be subject to enforcement action at any time.

LTA does not tolerate illegal or indiscriminate parking on any public roads marked with infringement lines or at critical areas, for the safety of all.
